





House of Representatives 57 D / 41 R



Senate 28 D / 21 R*





All House seats and half of the Senate seats were on the ballot in 2020, did not result in change of split, but there will be many new legislators.

Changes this year

- New members
- Remote
- Public & lobbyists not allowed in buildings
- Public testimony can be done remotely
- Different timelines and cutoff dates
- Limited number of policy bills
- Changing revenue forecasts





Legislative Agenda

2021 Priorities

- Capital project funding for the Point Hudson Jetty replacement project
- Allow for out of state vessels to remain in Washington State without paying use tax
- Maintaining the full ferry schedule of boats for the Port Townsend-Coupeville and Kingston-Edmonds routes
- Maintaining/expanding funding for derelict vessel remediation
- Extending 0.09% sales tax for rural economically distressed counties (including Jefferson county) to fund public facilities and economic development purposes
- Expanding retail authority to provision broadband by ports and public utility districts
- Model Toxics Control Act
