Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Boat Haven Stormwater System Improvement – Port Townsend Boatyard

The Port of Port Townsend is requesting a Statement of Qualifications (SOQs) from qualified engineering firms interested in preparing the preliminary and final design for stormwater system improvements to serve the Port of Port Townsend's Boat Haven Boatyard property (the "Boatyard"). The Boatyard is Washington State's largest open and publicly accessible yard, and hosts businesses that employ more than 400 skilled marine trades workers. The selected firm will survey the Port's existing stormwater collection and treatment system, identify appropriate management and operational changes, and prepare a final design for a cost-effective stormwater infrastructure system to be owned and maintained—all with an eye towards compliance with the reissued NPDES Boatyard General Stormwater Permit anticipated to be issued later this spring.

The Port received funding for a stormwater system improvement constructed of a centralized and automated chemically enhanced sand-filtration treatment or an equivalent treatment technique to serve the approximately 30-acre Port Townsend Boatyard. The original stormwater system was built in 1996 as conveyance only without treatment. Since then, there have been a number of improvements. Presently, the boatyard's existing stormwater system employs a combination of vaults, in-traffic and perimeter sand filters, presettling tanks with Chitosan, StormwaterRx Aquip® treatment units, and experimental biochar downspout units and in-ground treatment trenches before discharging to Port Townsend Bay. Devising a reconfigured and improved stormwater system is critically necessary in order to achieve regulatory compliance and to safeguard the jobs that depend upon this infrastructure.

The engineering firm retained for this project will be expected to:

- Assess the existing stormwater system serving the Port Townsend Boatyard. As noted above, even with source controls and improved Best Management Practice (BMP) enforcement, the current system appears incapable of achieving the anticipated benchmarks established for copper and zinc that will be included in the upcoming Boatyard Stormwater General Permit.
- Prepare a combination of management and operational recommendations, as well as the
 preliminary design for stormwater management system modifications (or alternative
 modifications) suited to the Port Townsend Boatyard topography, anticipated flow volumes and
 contaminant loading, and system affordability. Careful analysis is needed to determine which
 combination of management, operational and infrastructure changes represent the most
 suitable, cost-effective, and environmentally beneficial suite of modifications.
- Advise the Port on lifecycle costs for the greatest cost-effectiveness for operational and maintenance of the new system.
- Prepare final design and contract documents for solicitation of competitive bids for construction.

• Other services may include bid support and construction support.

The Port of Port Townsend reserves the right to retain the selected firm at the Port's sole discretion. This Project is funded through the State's 2021-2023 Capital Budget utilizing Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) from the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) stimulus funds through the US Treasury.

Statements of Qualifications (SOQ) submitted in response to this RFQ must include the following information:

- Consultant or firm name, phone numbers, postal, and email addresses.
- Identification of project team including prime and key subconsultants (max. 2 single-sided 8.5x11 pages).
- Résumés of key personnel (max. 5 single-sided 8.5x11 pages).
- List of past projects with a brief description and reference contact information for each (max. 5 single-sided 8.5x11 pages).
- A one-page cover letter (optional).

Evaluation Criteria

Submittals will be evaluated and ranked based on the following criteria:

- Qualifications (Expertise/Capacity of Firm(s), including any subconsultants);
- 2) Key personnel, including point of contact for task orders and any sub-consultants;
- 3) Relevant project professional engineering experience, specifically contract experience with municipalities or other government entities;
- 4) Relevant experience designing stormwater facilities for boatyards to meet NPDES permit standards.
