For the past two years Eron has also served as an elected commissioner for the Skagit Public Utility District charged with overseeing the PUD which provides water to about 65,000 residents and businesses. The PUD has 80 staff and an annual budget of \$30 million.

Other public sector experience includes a term as Mayor of La Conner, representation of Skagit 911 and participation on numerous public boards and commissions.

Eron has had extensive experience working with Ports including working on the SWIFT Center project which is a partnership between the Port of Skagit County, the city, the county and the state to transfer a 225 acre campus from the state to the port. Additionally, he has worked closely with the Port of Skagit on numerous projects including infrastructure, planning, permitting and continued viability of the Swinomish Channel.
