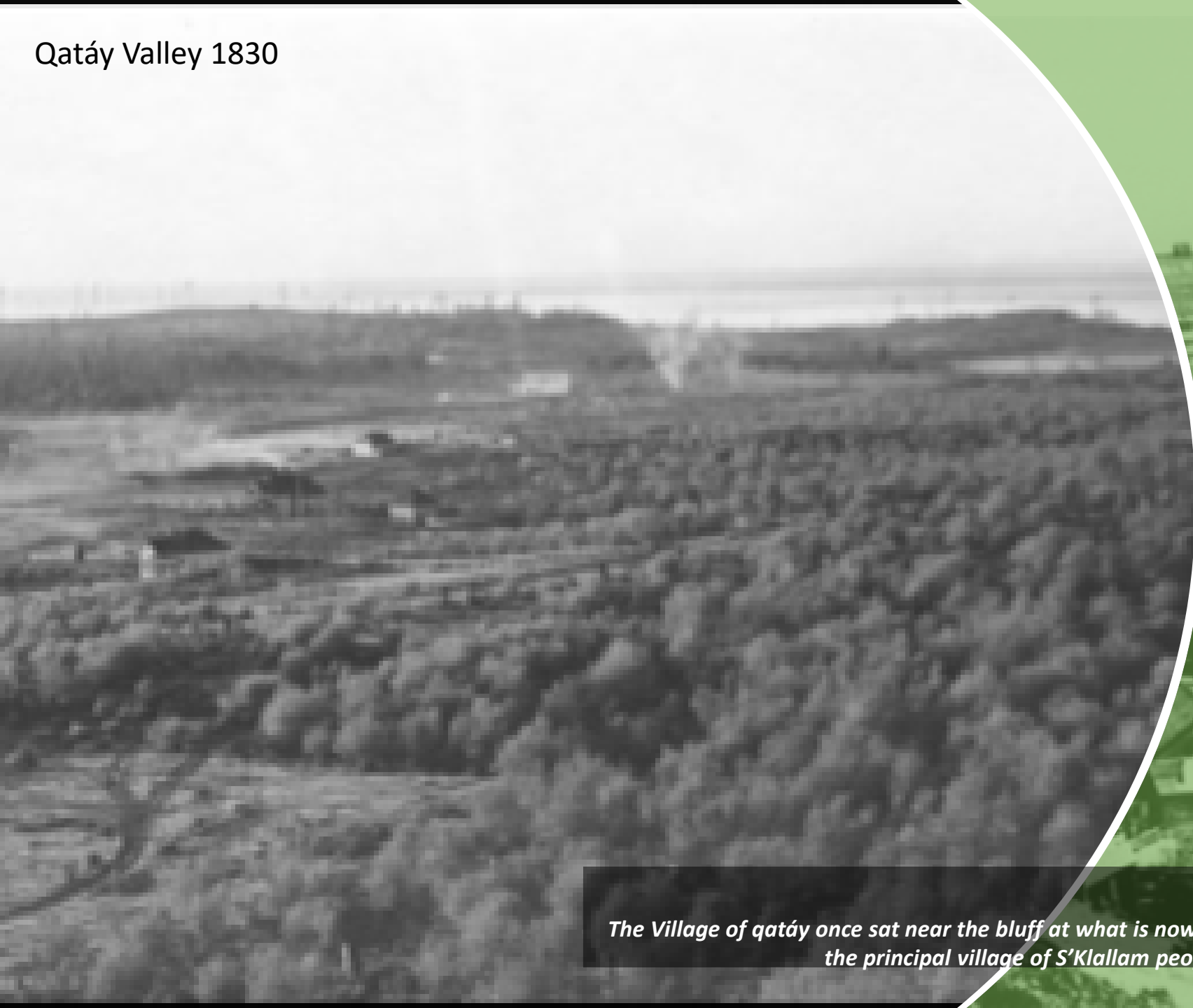

The Village of qatáy once sat near the bluff at what is now the corner of Monroe and Water Streets. It was once the principal village of S'Klallam people and home to Chief čičməhán

Historic Waterfront Character



SECTION 1. Provides that no permanent Indian houses shall be built on the beach from the Catholic Church to One Hundred and Fifty feet west of Tyler street.

Sec. 2. Requires the Marshal to notify Indians coming for purposes of trade, or otherwise, that they must not erect their mat lodges or tents, nor build fires within the above mentioned limits. Any person violating either of the above sections shall be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty dollars.

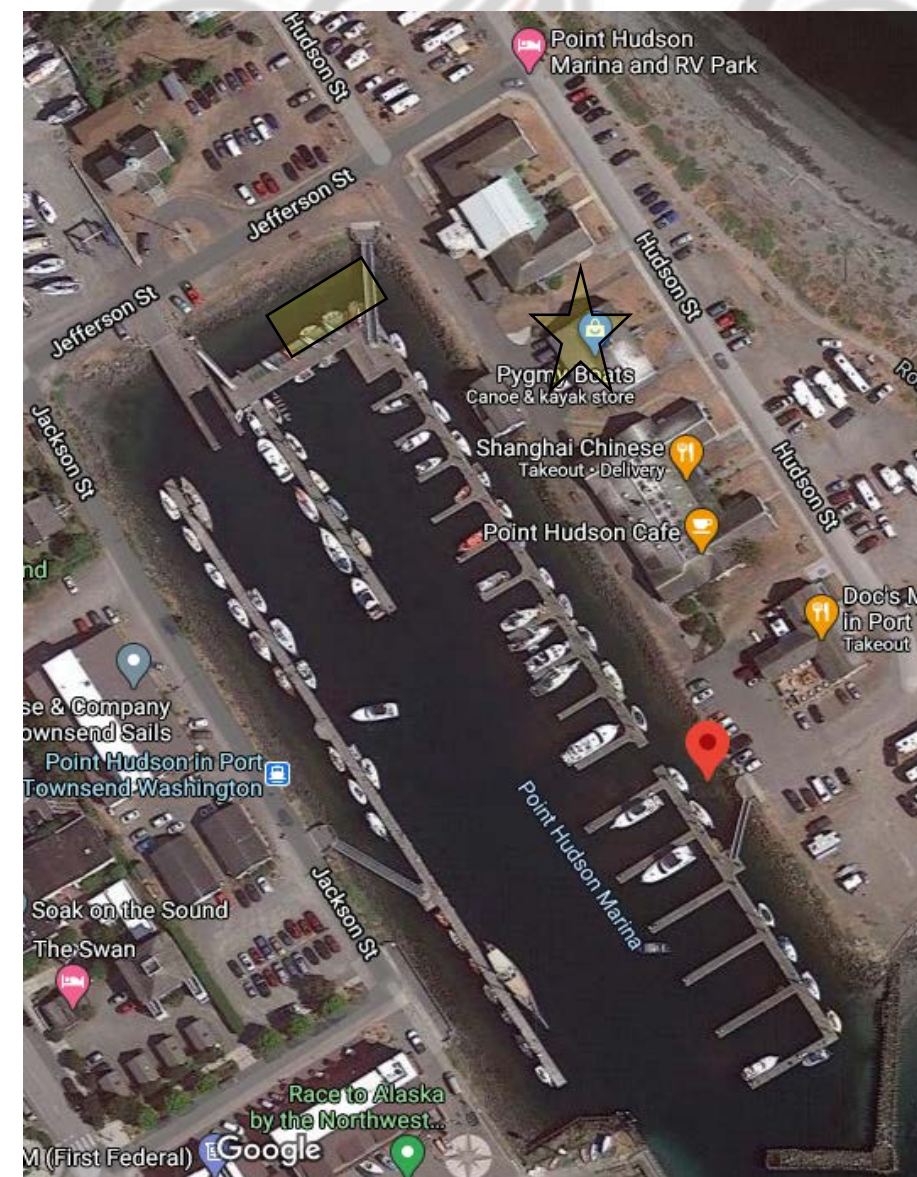

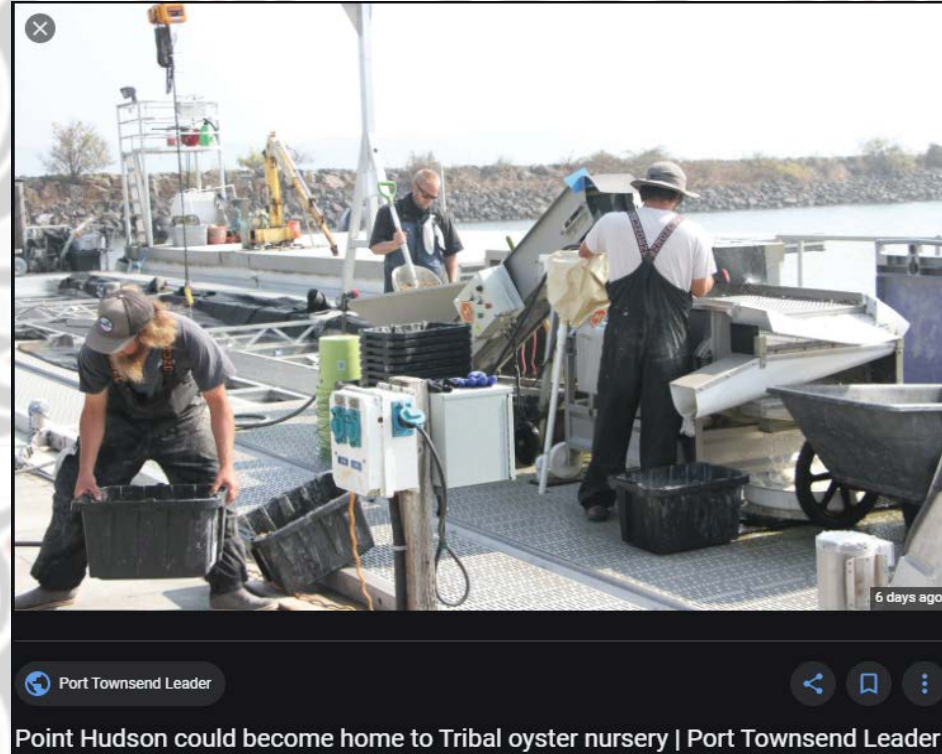
